Save the date for next week and attend our online **NTEU Bargaining Update Meeting at 12:30 (WA) 2:30 (Syd) on Friday 26th May**. It'll be an important meeting where we'll likely discuss any pay offers from the University, so please attend if you can make it.

We'll be holding three intensive bargaining sessions with management next week on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday (22-24 May). At these meetings we will be discussing staff claims for:

- 18% pay rise – our staff are some of the lowest paid university employees in the country. We deserve a pay rise that's commensurate with our skills and commitment.
- Increase superannuation from 13.25 to 17% in line with every other university in Australia.
- Increases to staff allowances
- Improved staff access to
- compassionate leave
- personal leave and
- family and domestic violence leave
- The inclusion of a flexible working arrangement clause (including working from home)
- Academic Freedom
